3. **Father of the Bride** – Bodice Corsage - will be pinned on a black background
4. **Mother of the Groom** – Wrist Corsage - will be pinned on a black round holder like a wrist
5. **Over the Moon** – Crescent Design Space allocated 61 cm (24") width 81 cm (32") depth

Definitions and Rules for Showing in the Welland Horticultural Society Rose and Flower Show 2026 Theme "Wedding Day Delight"

No Entries will be placed after 5:30 P.M.

Exhibitor must be a resident of the Niagara area. Each exhibitor must fill out a Registration Form, and each exhibit must have a Completed Entry Card placed with the entry on the table. Entry cards are available at time of show or by arrangement ahead of time.

Limited to one entry in any one category per exhibitor. Exhibits must remain in place until 8:15 p.m. Awards presentation starts at 8 pm. Awards will be presented, and photos taken, after which the exhibits may be removed. Exhibits must be picked up and removed by the exhibitor. For horticultural class entries, society vases must be used unless otherwise stated. Prize money will be mailed out within 2 weeks after the show, if not given out at the show.

The Welland Horticultural Society will not be responsible for loss or damage to containers, plants or personal property. N.B. Entries may be moved to a different horticultural class for the benefit of the entrant.

Entries in the Horticultural Division must have been grown by the exhibitor and in their possession for minimum of 3 months. More rules and definitions are in the schedule. If there is an abundance of entries, we will subdivide.

Judging standards are in accordance with Ontario Judging and Exhibiting Standards for Floral Design and Horticulture (OJES 2019 Edition). Judge's decision is final.

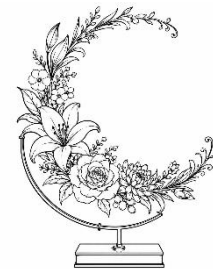
Collection – a specified number of different cut flowers, foliage, potted plants, branches, fruits, vegetables, or nuts, exhibited for cultural perfection. Individual items in the collection should be named.

Corsage - a design to be worn for adornment that features plant material. It may be enhanced by accessories such as beads, ribbons, etc. Factors to consider are the size and technique, including the reverse side, and the accessories. A corsage may be designed to be pinned to a bodice, worn on a wrist, attached to a purse, etc. (for our show it is pinned to bodice style and wrist.)

Crescent – a Traditional Line Mass Design in the shape of a partial circle.

Hand-Tied Bouquet – A design of plant material making use of its own stems, which are usually tied with string, raffia, or ribbon. It can be hand-held or inserted in a container.

Mass Modern – A design with a large quantity of plant material. A design of multiple groups (usually 3 to 5) of plant material (each group composed of one variety of plant material) juxtaposed to give a sculptural effect. It may be a solid mass or a mass with space emphasizing strong colours, textures and forms.

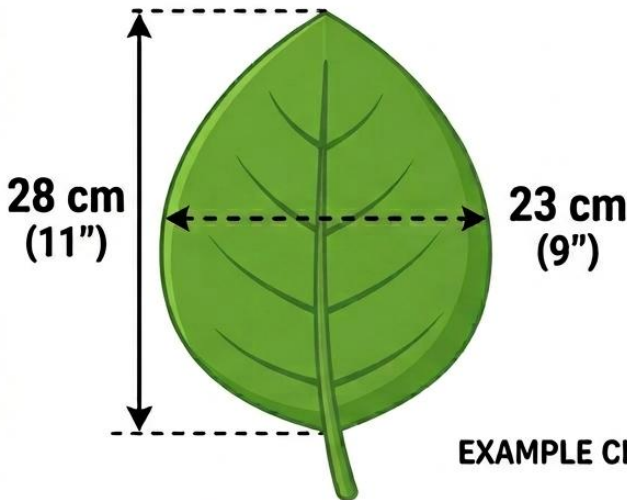

Hosta Leaves Sizing

The following is a size table used by the American Hosta Society. It uses the total square centimetres of the leaf a measured by multiplying the length of the leaf from the leaf tip to the intersection with the petiole, by the width of the leaf at its widest point. Example: 15 cm (6”) from leaf tip to petiole multiplied by the widest width of 10 cm (4”) would equal 150 cm (24”) squared. Therefore, this could be considered a small leaved class when compared to the chart below.

Leaf Size	Square Centimeters	Square Inches
Giant Leaved	774 or greater sq. cm	120 or greater sq. in
Large Leaved	413 to less than 774 sq. cm	64 to less than 120 sq. in
Medium Leaved	193 to less than 413 sq. cm	30 to less than 64 sq. in
Small Leaved	39 to less than 193 sq. cm	6 to less than 30 sq. in
Miniature Leaved	Less than 39 sq. cm	Less than 6 sq. in

HOW TO CALCULATE HOSTA LEAF SIZE



$$[\text{Length in cm}] \times [\text{Widest Width in cm}] = [\text{Total Square Centimetres}]$$

$$28 \text{ cm} \times 23 \text{ cm} = 644 \text{ cm}^2$$

EXAMPLE CLASSIFICATION

$$[\text{Length in cm}] \times [\text{Widest Width}] = [\text{Total Square Centimetres}]$$

$$28 \text{ cm} \times 23 \text{ cm} = 644 \text{ cm}^2$$

Example result: 644 cm² (99 in²)

HOSTA LEAF SIZE CLASSES

Class Name	Square Centimeters	Square Inches
Giant Leaved	774 or greater sq. cm	120 or greater sq. in
Large Leaved	413 to less than 774 sq. cm	64 to less than 120 sq. in
Medium Leaved	193 to less than 413 sq. cm	30 to less than 64 sq. in
Small Leaved	39 to less than 193 sq. cm	6 to less than 30 sq. in
Miniature Leaved	Less than 39 sq. cm	Less than 6 sq. in
